Mornings Don't Have to be a Struggle

Mornings can be tough! Getting our children out of bed, dressed, and to school on time can be challenging. Then add on to that getting yourself ready; sometimes it seems nearly impossible. But, there are some things that can help.

First, get into a routine. When children know what to expect on a daily basis, getting going in the morning can become much easier. Try to wake up at the same time each day and follow the same steps. At first it will be difficult, but keep at it! It will eventually become habit.

Second, prepare as much as you can the night before. Set out clothes for children and yourself. Prepare breakfast the night before, so it can be heated and taken on the go or eaten at the table together. If things need to be taken into school the next day, gather everything, and put it by the door. Then you can just grab it and go.

The last thing that can help make mornings easier actually starts with bedtime. Set up a bedtime routine and stick to it. Set a bedtime that allows your children to get the necessary amount of sleep based upon the time you need to wake up for the day. Well rested children can make the mornings much more pleasant!
